AIDNW Visitation Program volunteers and Board members have been advocating for COVID vaccines for detainees with the management of the Northwest ICE Processing Center (formerly the NW Detention Center). The Facility Administrator officially confirmed to us on April 14 that the Washington State Health Department did offer a vaccine clinic on April 2 inside the NWIPC, for both detainees and staff, and that all who chose to receive a vaccine were provided a vaccine card. Since the vaccine is a personal choice, exact numbers could not be provided; however, he confirmed that there was good participation.

AIDNW Board members Bill Lloyd and Patti Kilpatrick, and visitation volunteer Dianne Niemann participated in the March 24 GEO-called Community Relations Meeting. At that time, they requested detainees and staff vaccinations since WA state had just opened shots for prisoners/detainees in congregate settings effective April 1. In addition, they requested that a negative COVID test card be placed in all released detainees belongings upon departure, if that was the case.

When detainees are released, AIDNW volunteers meet them at our Welcome Center RV outside the gate and provide transport to hotels or transportation centers. Thus, also our volunteers will now be further protected. AIDNW, through its dedicated volunteers, continues to support equitable health care for the NWIPC detainees, in collaboration with Tacoma City Council's Commission on Immigrant and Refugee Affairs, and other regional organizations.
